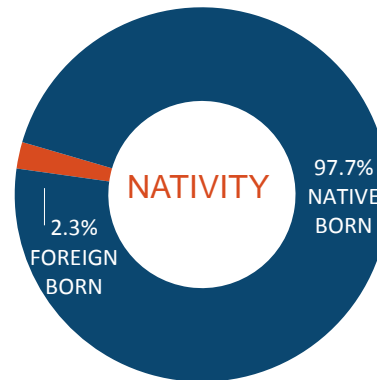

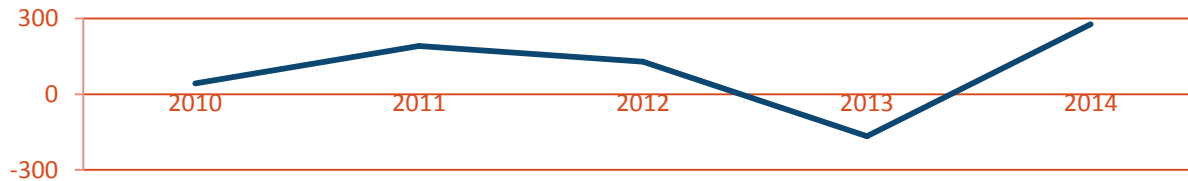

MIGRATION



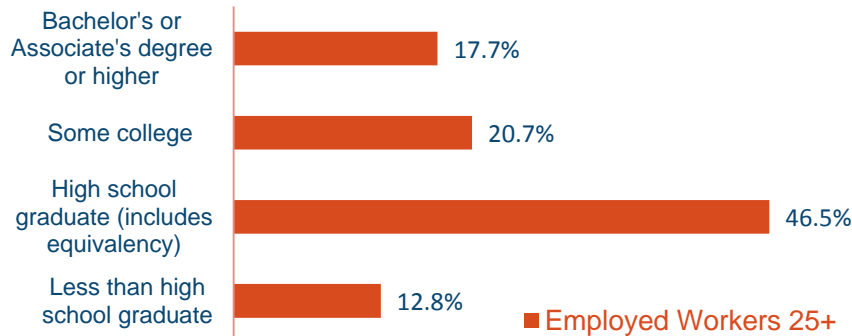
NET MIGRATION (2010-2014)

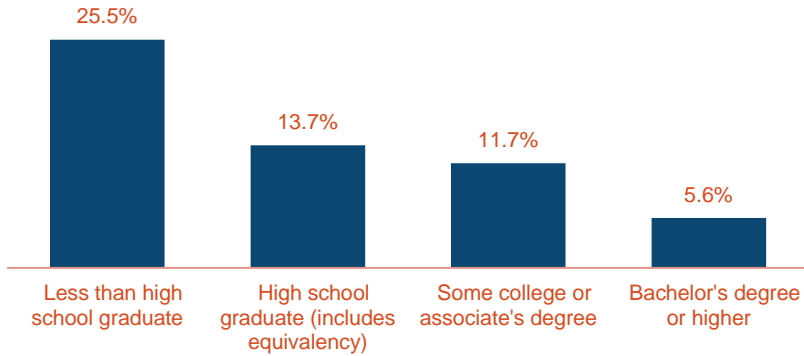

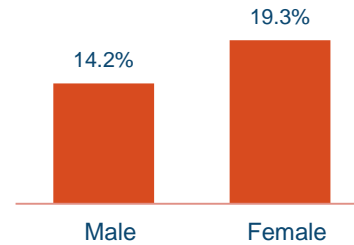

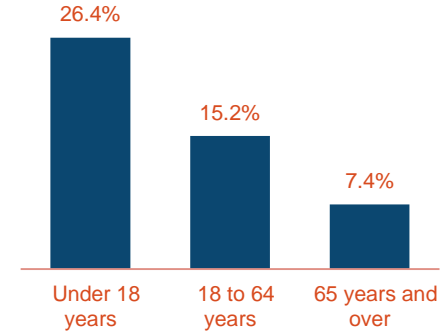

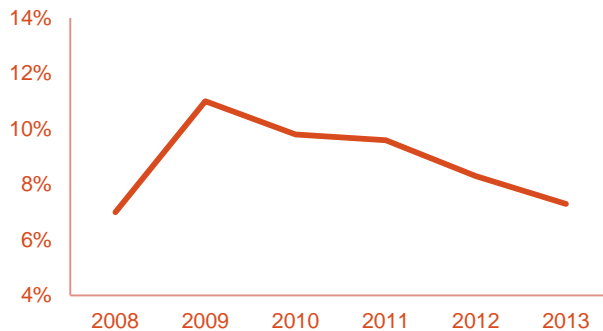

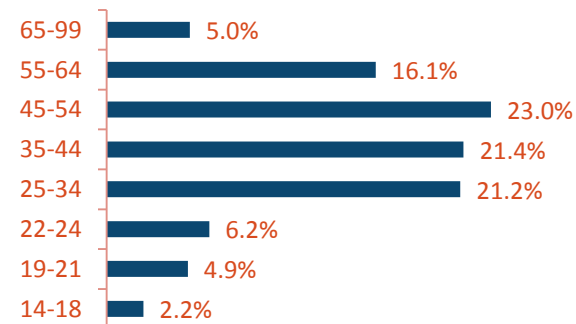

PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL EMPLOYEES BY AGE (Q4 2014)



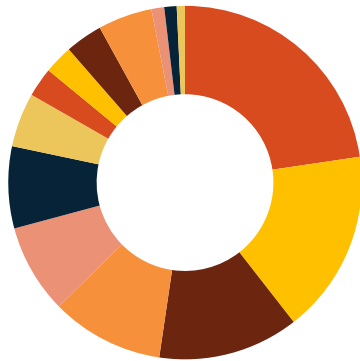
