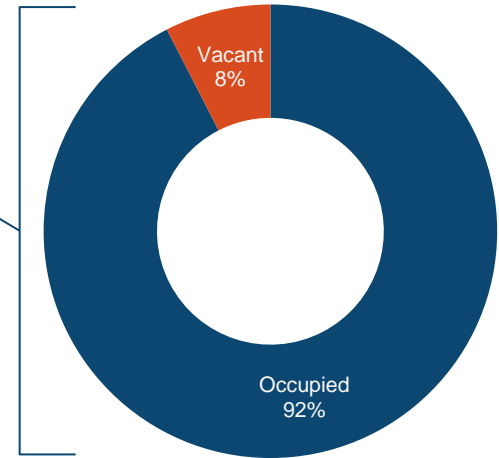

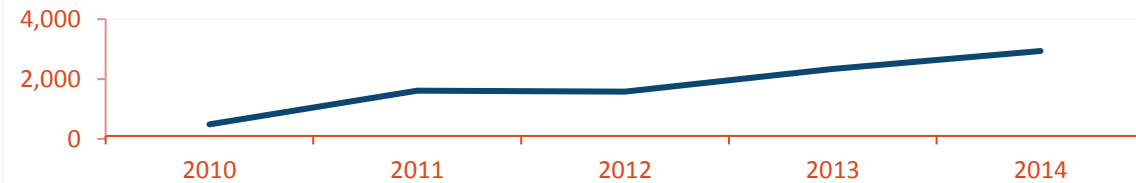

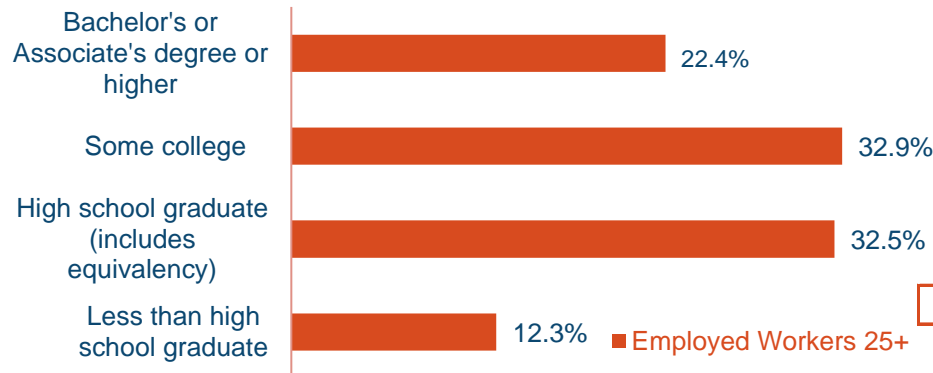

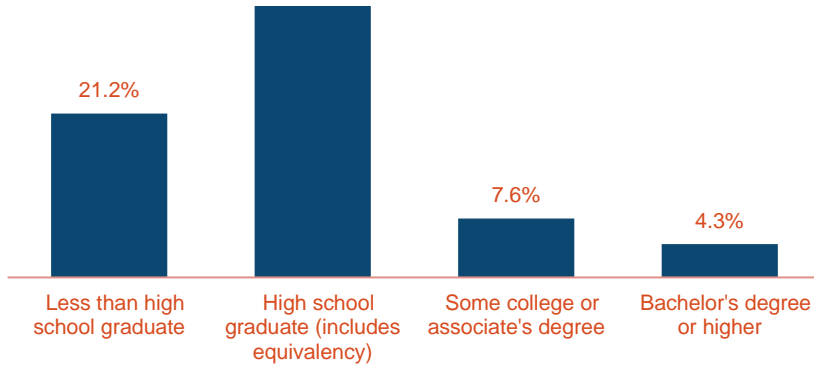

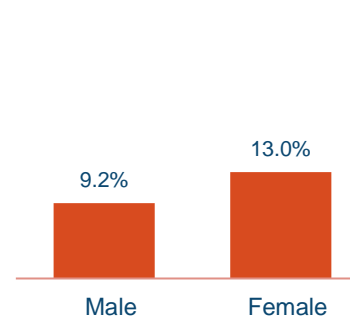

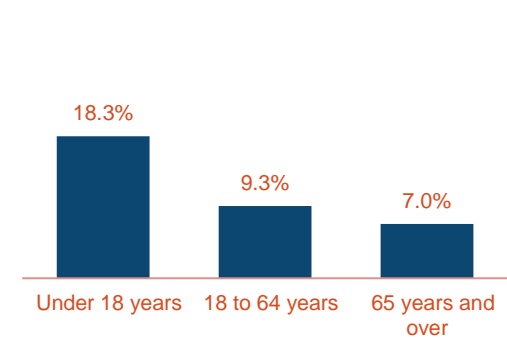
EDUCATION (25+ YEARS OLD)

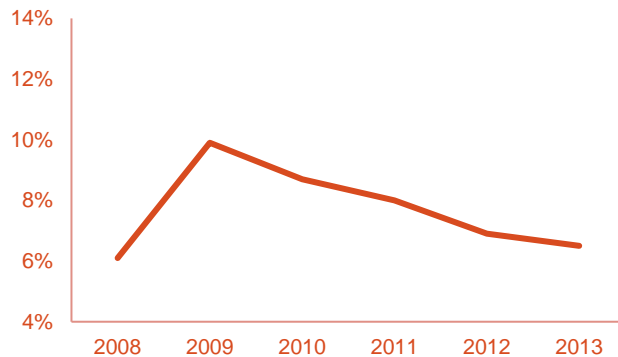

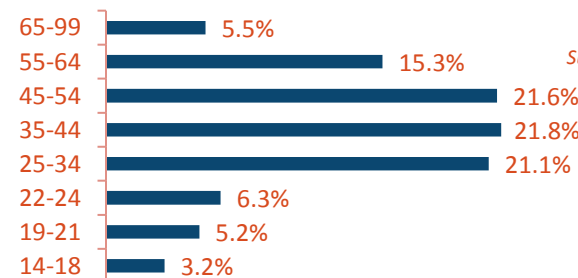

PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL EMPLOYEES BY AGE (Q4 2014)



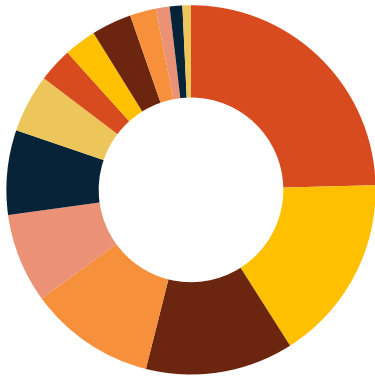
